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Section 2: Maintained school sector

School teacher

Registration in the category of school teacher requires applicants to hold Qualified Teacher Status (QTS). Applicants that do not have QTS but are working in a state-maintained school should register as school learning support workers.

Those who need to be registered in the school teacher category are, but not limited to:

- full-time, part-time, and supply school teachers who hold QTS
- peripatetic school teachers
- advisory school teachers who are qualified school teachers and who spend a proportion of their time in a teaching capacity, involving direct unsupervised pupil contact
- home tutors, employed by a local authority to teach children

As there is cross border working between Wales and England, employers should note that practitioners who have been awarded Qualified Teacher Learning and Skills (QTLS) are not recognised as Qualified School Teachers under legislation in Wales.

[School teachers trained overseas can apply for recognition](#) as a school teacher eligible to practise in Wales.

School learning support workers

A school learning support worker means a person who is not employed as a qualified school teacher, but who provides or supports the provision of any of the following services by a school teacher:

- planning and preparing lessons and courses of study for pupils
- delivering lessons to pupils (includes via distance learning or computer aided techniques)
- assessing or reporting on the development, progress, and attainment of pupils

A person can only be employed as a school learning support worker to provide the above services if all the following requirements are met:

- they are registered with the EWC in the category of school learning support worker
- they provide the above services with direct interaction with learners to assist, or support the work of school teachers, or nominated teachers in the school
- they provide the services under the direction and supervision of school teachers, or nominated teachers in accordance with arrangements made by the head teacher of the school
- the head teacher is satisfied that they have the skills, expertise, and experience to provide the services

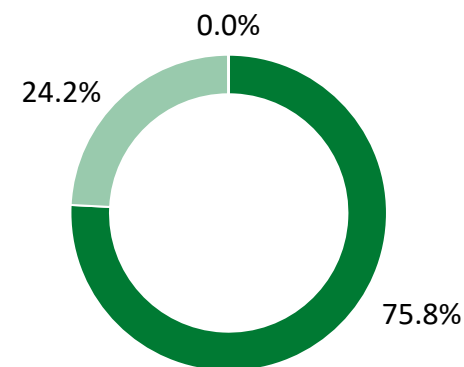

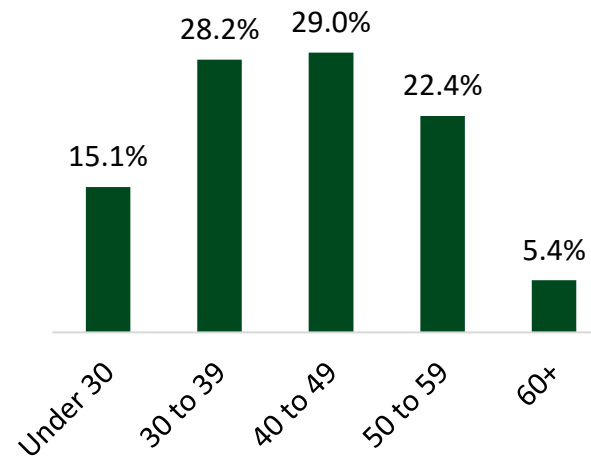


Chart 2: The age of school teachers in 2025.

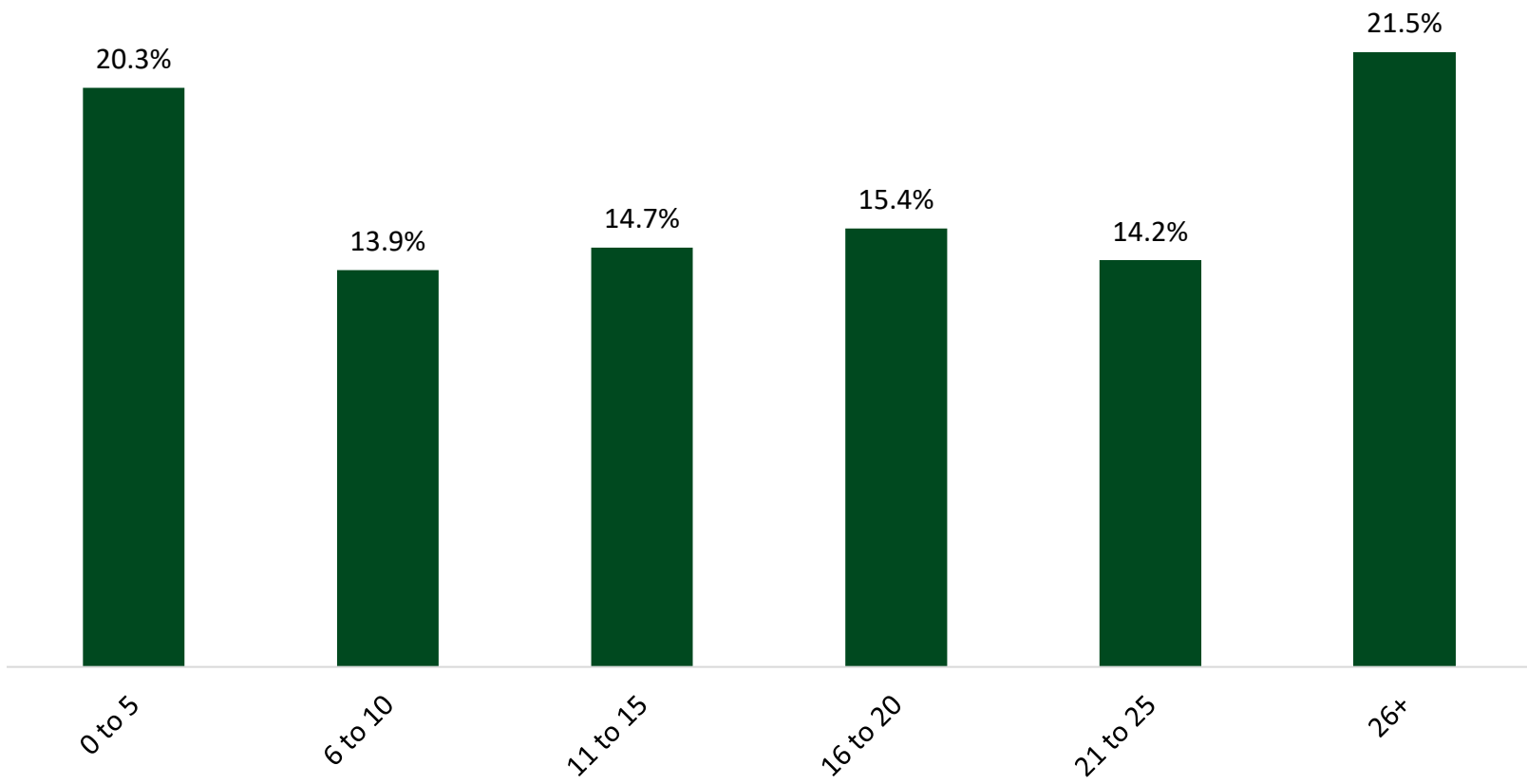


Chart 3: Years since qualified teacher status for registered school teachers in 2025.

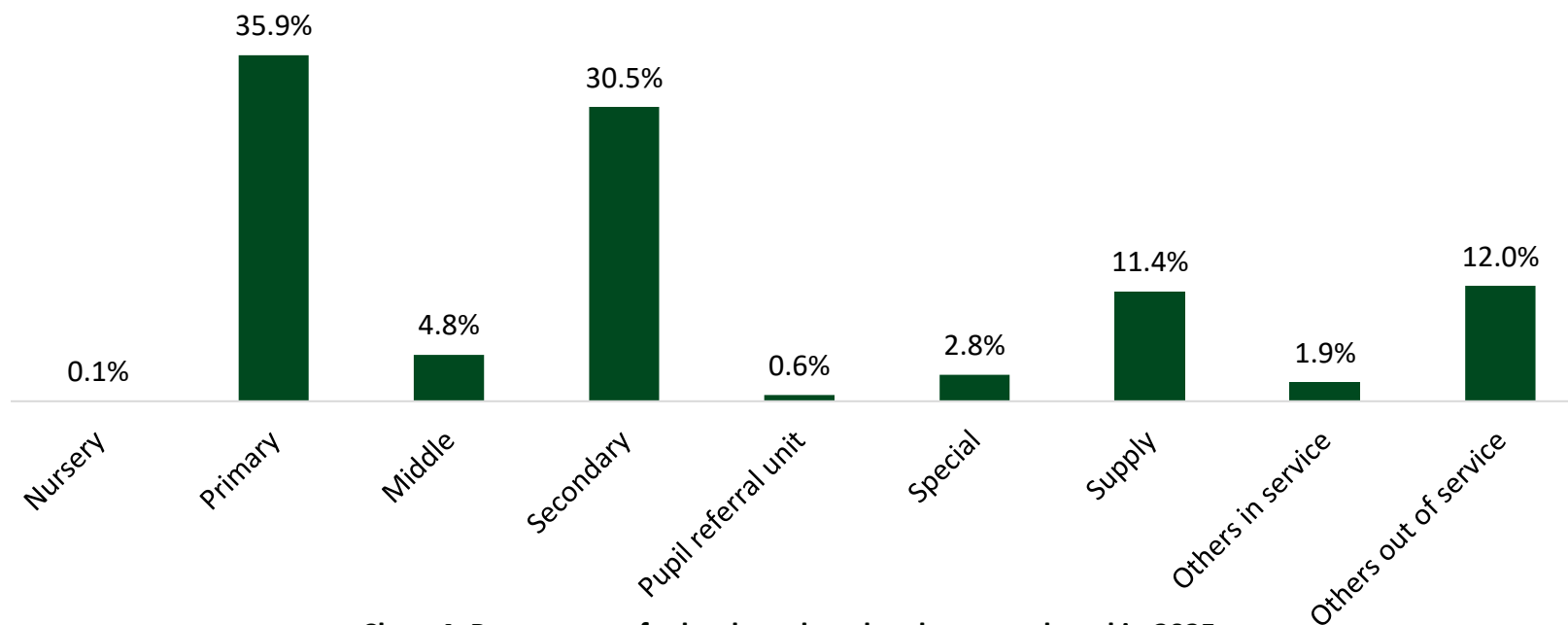


Chart 4: Percentage of school teachers by phase employed in 2025.

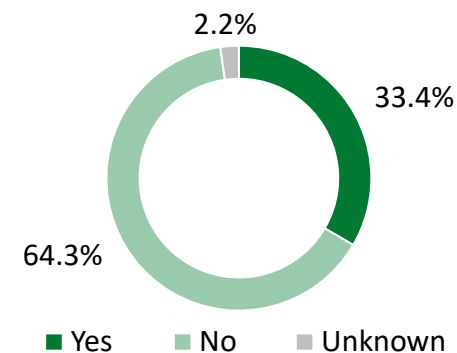


Chart 5: School teachers by ability to speak Welsh in 2025.

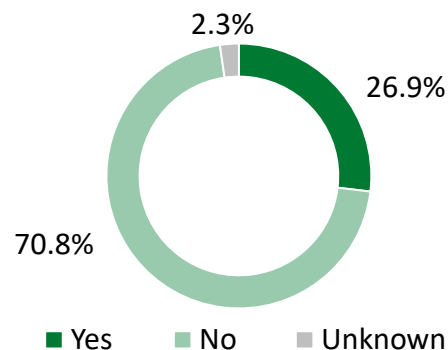


Chart 6: School teachers by ability to work through the medium of Welsh in 2025.

Initial Teacher Education (ITE) training may have been completed in Wales or England or elsewhere in the UK, either through a course of ITE or through an employment based route. As indicated, only those completing ITE within the secondary age range for example, KS3/age 11 or above have been included.

The subject information is entered by the ITE institution using the Joint Academic Coding System (JACS) codes set by [HESA](#). The first subject is the main subject, institutions are able to enter a second subject if applicable. If more than two subjects are studied, the two considered most important are listed. The subjects are grouped by the EWC in order to produce the above summary table. Please note, QTS is non age range or subject specific however, secondary students do have an ITE subject specialism. 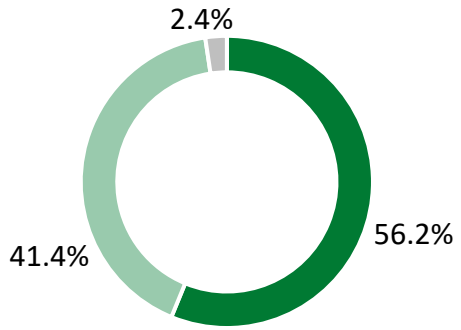


Chart 7: Biology

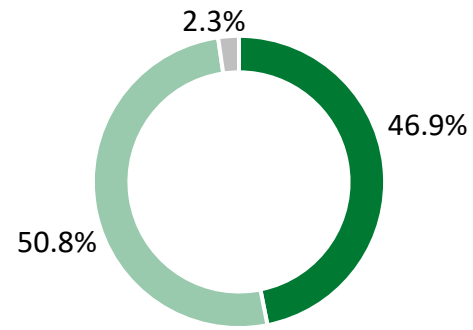


Chart 8: Chemistry

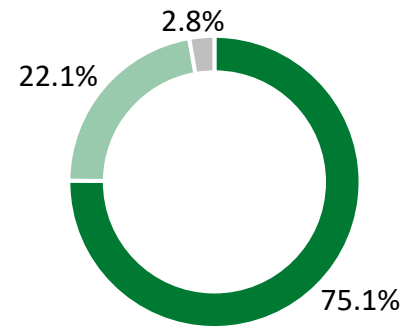


Chart 9: English

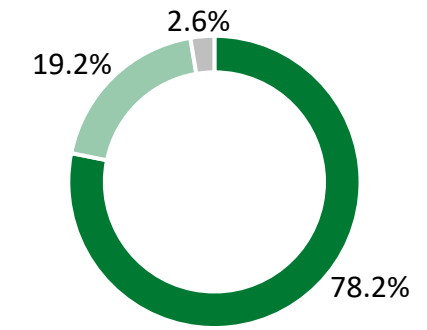


Chart 10: Mathematics

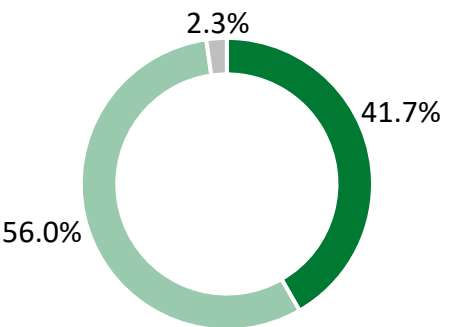


Chart 11: Physics

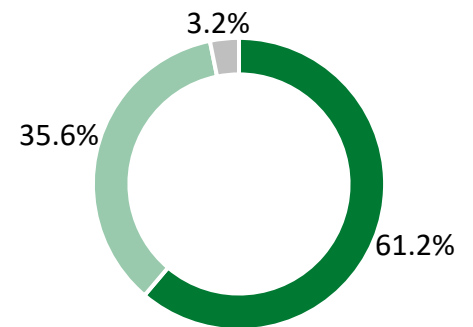


Chart 12: Religious education

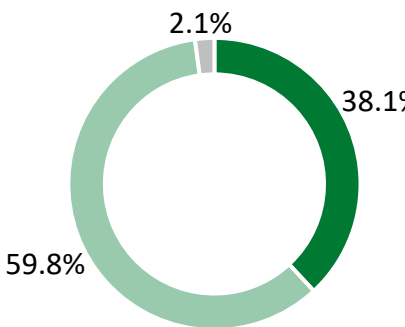

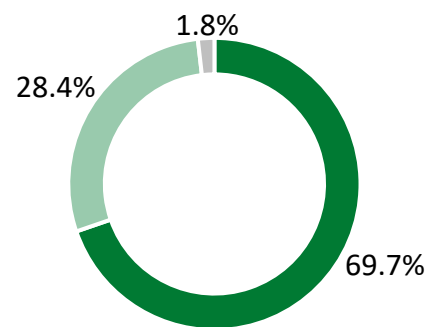

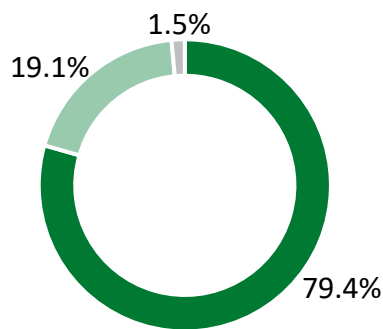

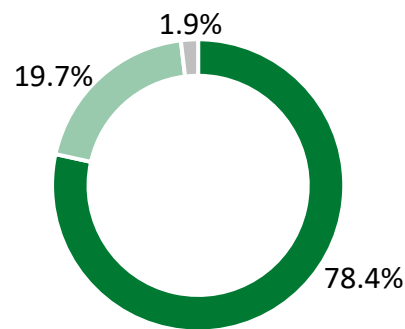


Chart 16: Design and technology

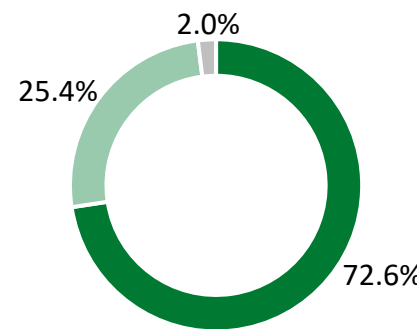


Chart 17: Geography

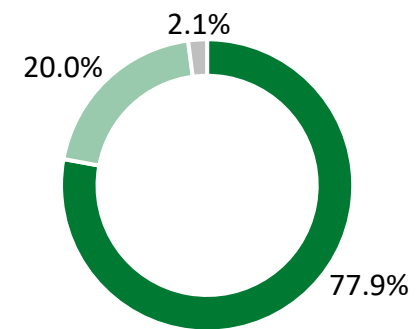


Chart 18: History

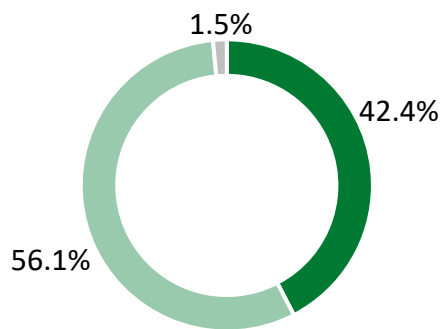


Chart 19: Information technology

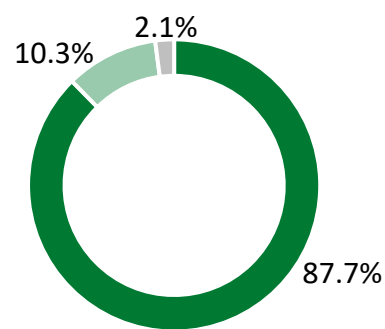


Chart 20: Modern foreign languages

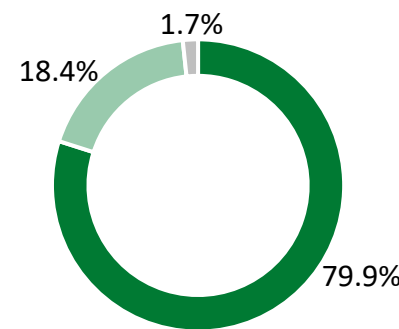

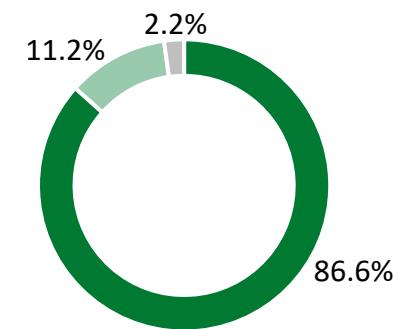

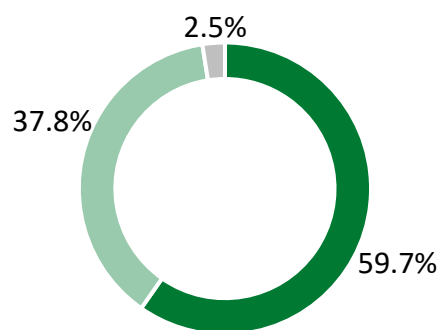


Chart 23: Business studies

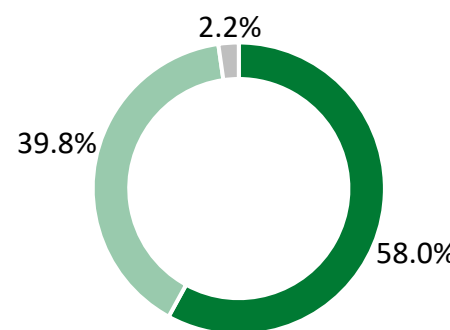


Chart 24: Drama

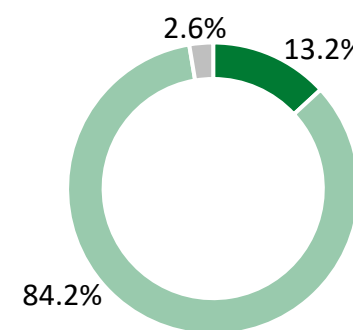


Chart 25: Economics

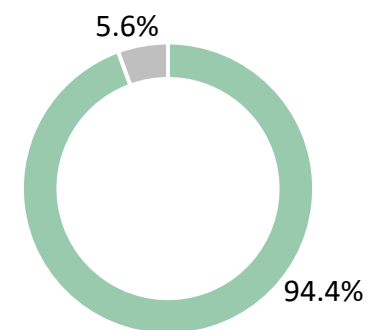


Chart 26: Engineering

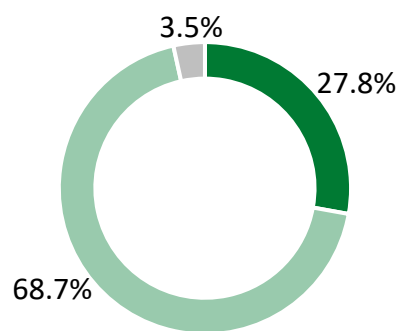


Chart 27: Home economics

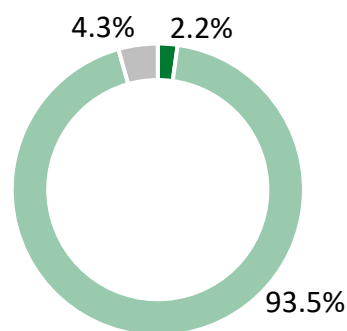


Chart 28: Humanities

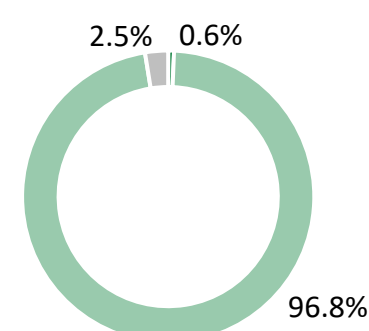


Chart 29: Media studies

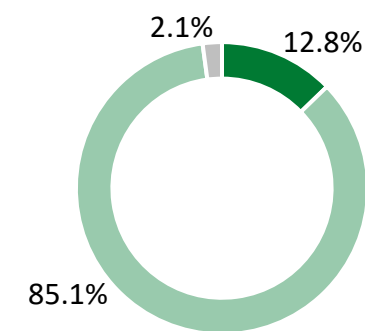

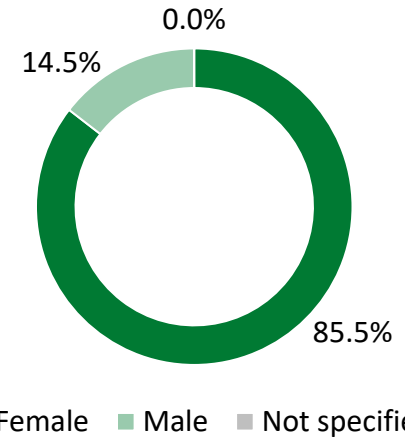


Chart 31: The gender of school learning support workers in 2025.

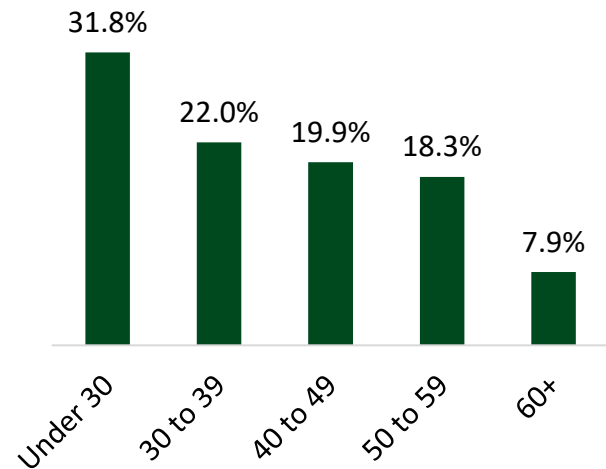


Chart 32: The age of school learning support workers in 2025.

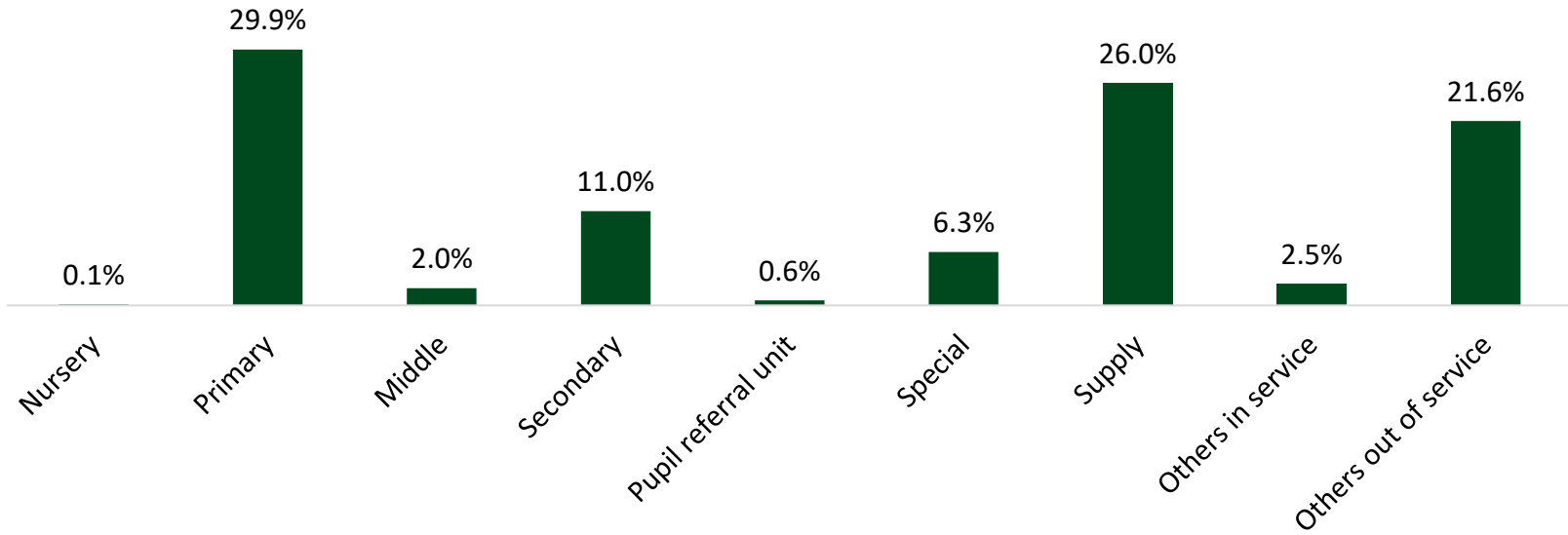


Chart 33: Percentage of school learning support workers by phase employed in 2025.

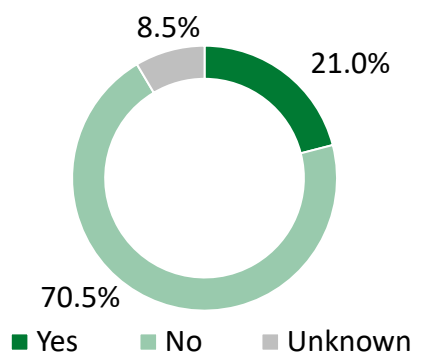


Chart 34: School learning support workers by ability to speak Welsh in 2025.

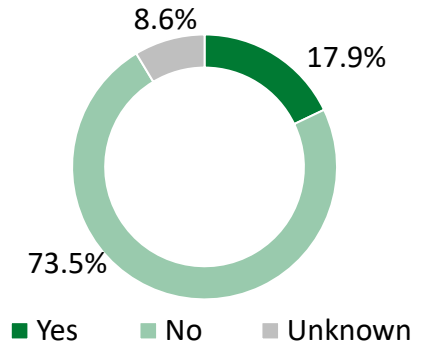


Chart 35: School learning support workers by ability to work through the medium of Welsh in 2025.

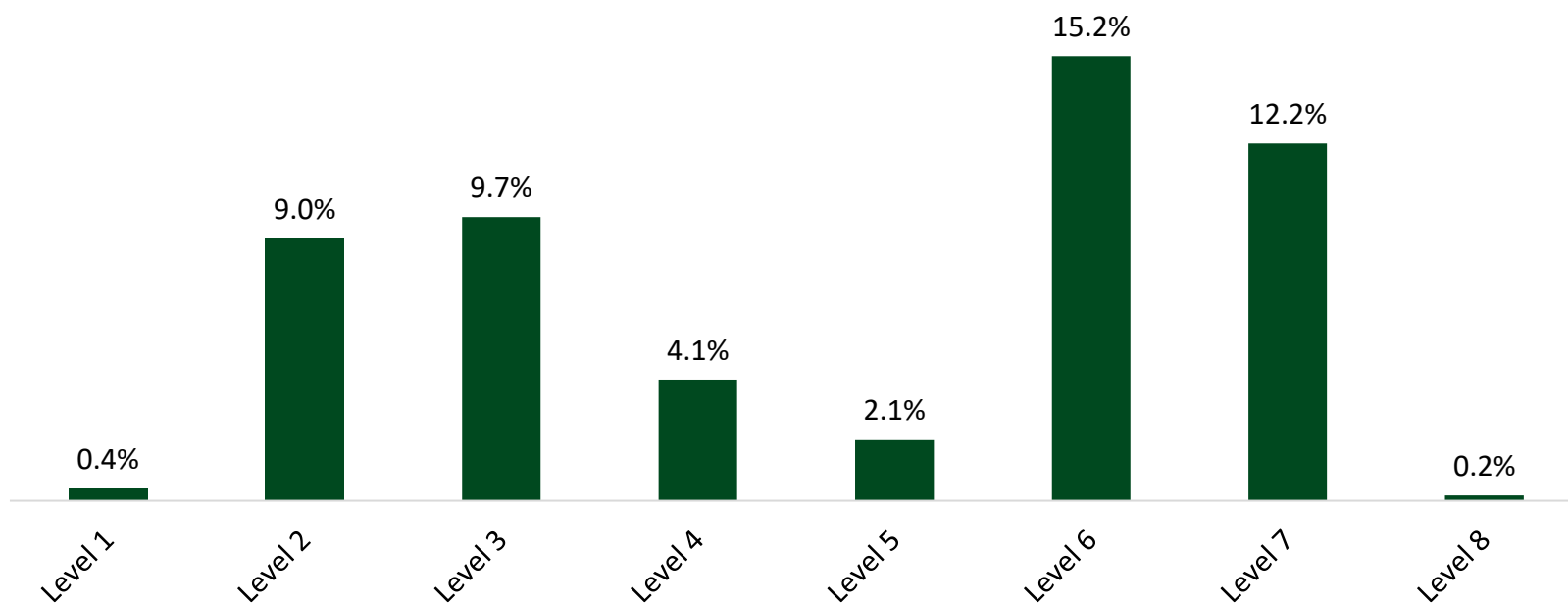


Chart 36: Percentage of school learning support workers highest level of qualifications in 2025.
