Supply within the school teacher and school learning support worker categories

The EWC is the independent regulator for the education workforce in Wales. We register teachers and learning support workers in schools and further education institutions, as well as work-based learning practitioners and qualified youth/youth support workers. All data included in this summary is derived from the EWC Register of Education Practitioners. The data shown is at 1 March 2021 (and 1 March for the respective year where previous years are stated).

1. Supply within the school teacher category

1.1 Number of supply school teachers

- 4,222 of registered school teachers have supply as their main employment
- Of those, 2,559 are registered as school teachers only and 1,663 are also registered in other categories.
- Of the 4,222, 1,458 are also registered as school learning support workers (34.5%).
- 1,615 registrants undertake supply work in addition to their main contracted employment in a maintained school in Wales. They are not included in the below tables.

1.2 Age profile of supply school teachers


The age profile of supply school teachers differs from all school teachers. In particular, supply teachers are more commonly under the age of 29 or over the age of 50.In addition, 21.2% of supply school teachers are aged 29 or under in comparison to 16.4% of all school teachers.

As with all school teachers, over 75% of supply school teachers are female.



1.5 Employment of supply school teachers

3,232 supply teachers (76.6%) are employed through an agency. 930 supply teachers (22.0%) are employed through a local authority. Of this figure, 16.8% are employed by Powys, 10.2% the Isle of Anglesey and 8.9% Gwynedd. 208 registrants who have a supply record in a local authority as their main employment also have another supply record in an agency. 144 registrants who have a supply record in an agency as their main employment also have another supply record in a local authority.


A larger percentage of school teachers within the school teacher category are able to work through the medium of Welsh compared to the number of supply teachers (27.1% compared to 20.6%).

1.8 Induction status of supply school teachers

Statutory induction has been a requirement in Wales since September 2003 and applies to all school teachers who gained their qualified teacher status (QTS) after the 1 April 2003. The induction status is based on information extracted from the Register in March 2021.




1.9 Phase trained at initial teacher education for supply school teachers

Over half of supply teachers are primary trained (55.1%).




% of all school teachers

2. Supply within the school learning support worker (LSW) category

The data shown is at 1 March 2021 and relates to registered school learning support workers. Supply is as per the registered category therefore a registrant will appear as supply in all categories that they are registered in.

2.1 Number of supply school learning support workers


- 8,106 of registered school learning support workers have supply as their main employment.
- Of those, 1,798 are also registered as school teachers (22.2%).
- 1,386 registrants undertake supply work in addition to their main contracted employment in a maintained school in Wales. They are not included in the below tables.

2.2 Age profile of supply school learning support workers

The age profile of supply school learning support workers differs from all school learning support workers. In particular, supply school learning support workers are more commonly 29 or under (44.5%) compared to 28.6% for all school learning support workers.

2.3 Gender of supply school learning support workers

As with the school learning support worker category as a whole, over 80% of supply school learning support workers are female. There are however a larger percentage of males within supply at 19.5% compared to 13.7% within the school learning support worker category.

2.4 Employment of supply school learning support workers

7,451 of supply school learning support workers (91.9%) are employed through an agency. 628 supply school learning support workers are employed through a local authority. Of this figure, 10.2% of the local authority supply school learning support workers are employed by Pembrokeshire, 9.7% Flintshire and 9.7% Conwy. 145 registrants who have a supply record in a local authority as their main employment also have another supply record in an agency. 69 registrants who have a supply record in an agency as their main employment also have another supply record in a local authority.





Notes

- 1. The data in this summary was drawn from the EWC Register of Education Practitioners on the 1 March 2021.
- 2. The employment information was extracted from the Register in May 2021 following the fee renewal process to ensure the most complete employment information.
- 3. Registrant numbers are recorded as actuals rather than full-time equivalents.
- 4. Supply registrants in the school teacher and school learning support worker categories are only counted once regardless of the number of employers that they undertake supply work for.
- 5. If a registrant in the school teacher category has multiple employment records e.g. a school teacher role in a local authority and a supply teacher role for an agency, the school teacher role in a local authority would take precedence as the main employment and therefore they would not be include in the supply figures, this has been noted in the relevant sections.
- 6. If registrants undertake supply work for more than one employer, the first supply record held is used. As a result, there are some registrants who are employed on a supply basis with an agency and a local authority.
- 7. For some sections, a comparison has been made against the school teacher and school learning support worker category as a whole. Further statistics can be found in the Annual Education Workforce Statistics for Wales 2021 available at www.ewc.wales.
- 8. Percentages may not total 100 due to rounding.
