Data taken from the Register of Education Practitioners on 28 July 2016

Notes:-

- All data provided relates to registered practitioners whose primary registration category is "school teacher" and the numbers are displayed as "actuals" rather than "full-time equivalents";
- Supply school teachers are only counted once regardless of the number of LA supply lists on which they are included; or supply agencies they work for (apart from table 9);
- The number of registered school teachers is "real time" and can go up or down, depending on new registrations and de-registrations.

5. Number of school teachers registered with EWC by Welsh Language

When making an application for registration or amending a registered teacher record, teachers are advised to consider the following criteria when answering the relevant questions in relation to their Welsh language ability:-

Welsh Speaker: - answer "Yes" if they consider themselves to be fluent or fairly fluent in the Welsh language, otherwise answer "No"

Able to teach through the medium of Welsh: - answer "Yes" if they are currently teaching or have ever taught through the medium of Welsh, otherwise answer "No"

Able to teach Welsh as a second language: - The current requirement is for pupils in English speaking schools in Wales to be taught Welsh as a second language. In the primary phase, it is recognised that the ability of teachers to teach Welsh as a second language will vary depending on a range of factors including the teachers own Welsh language ability and training. If they are a teaching in a primary school they are advised to answer "Yes" if they are currently teaching or have taught Welsh as a second language otherwise they are advised to answer "No".

Some registered teachers do not provide this information and the relevant fields in their record on the Council's Register are marked as "Unknown".
